WATER SOFTNESS

The typical softness for ILRW's rural water is 7-10 grains per gallon. During maintenance, you may experience harder water for brief periods. This may increase residue on items such as plumbing fixtures, appliances, and dishes. During this period, your water will continue to be safe for consumption.

TREATMENT PLANT MAINTENANCE

In a continuing effort to provide high quality drinking water, on March 26, 2023, the annual maintenance of the Clay treatment plant facility will begin for approximately one week as recommended by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and lowa Department of Natural Resources. It is during this annual event that we have an opportunity to clean and inspect water softening equipment that is normally submerged under 150,000 gallons of water. The water being produced during this period of maintenance will continue to meet all federal and state water quality standards and is completely safe to drink. We appreciate your patience and understanding.

METER PIT ACCESS

Meter pits should be accessed only by ILRW service technicians, as ILRW's water system property. Customers, contractors or plumbers should not attempt to access a meter pit. Doing so can be dangerous and your safety is important to us. Damage to equipment can also easily occur, resulting in costly repairs.

Please keep all obstructions, such as decking, landscaping and debris, clear of the meter pit at all times. Keeping meter pits accessible to our staff at all times is extremely important. Thank you for your cooperation.

Rates: Regularly scheduled appointments are \$40.00. Spring reconnection fees were paid last fall so there is no fee due in the spring, with the exception of emergency or afterhours/weekend appointments. See below.

Convenience: Emergency appointments can also be scheduled any time, any day! Appointments scheduled without a 24-hour notice are \$75.00 and after-hours/weekend appointments are \$150.00.


